For 2010-2011, Krause Later Elementary made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in English language arts and mathematics. While we are pleased to have reached this important goal, we are continuously working to improve. We appreciate the continued support of parents, staff and our community in this effort.

Additional Information Regarding School Improvement

1. **PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL-** At Krause Later Elementary, students are placed in heterogeneous groups according to boy/girl ratios, balanced achievement levels, learning styles, student personalities, and much more. Parents may fill out a special need's request form to accommodate students with academic or social needs as well.
2. **THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN-** Krause Later Elementary recently completed a Quality Assurance Review (QAR) by North Central Accreditation with high commendations in all areas. Two recommendations were made by the QAR visiting team: 1) Strengthen connection and transition to Armada Middle School. 2) Incorporate technology

into lessons seamlessly. To that end, our fifth grade team will be meeting with Armada Middle School staff each trimester to discuss critical transition support for fifth grade students. In regard to technology, administration is pursuing wireless technology for each classroom. Our school's improvement goals for this year will focus on improving informational reading strategies, conceptual understanding in math (focus in geometry, fractions, and measurement), and writing in the content areas.

3. **IDENTIFY HOW TO ACCESS A COPY OF THE CORE CURRICULUM, A DESCRIPTION OF ITS IMPLEMENTATION AND AN EXPLANATION OF THE VARIANCES FROM THE STATE'S MODEL-** Krause Later Elementary curriculum tightly aligns with the Michigan Curriculum Framework. In the past two years, curriculum pacing guides have been developed by professional staff for English Language Arts (ELA), Social Studies, and Mathematics. Grade Level Content Expectations (GLCE's) are divided up by content area and month, along with suggested activities when appropriate. Copies of these core curriculum guides/maps will be available in the office upon request after we complete the transition to the Common Core Standards (CCS).

4. **THE AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHEIVEMENT RESULTS FOR ANY LOCAL COMPETENCY TESTS OR NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS-** Krause Later Elementary uses both DIBELS (Dynamic Indicator of Early Literacy Skills), Northwest Evaluation Association (NWEA) and MEAP (Michigan Education Assessment Program) to measure student progress, in addition to curriculum-based assessments. Reading ability, measured by the composite DIBELS Next assessment, is divided into categories of support for students. Students falling within the "core" support area will ONLY need reading support within the classroom in reading instruction. Students identified with "strategic" levels of support have instructional reading needs that will require supplemental programming to achieve success. Finally, students identified as "intensive" will need a great deal of support in the classroom and with pertinent interventions to be successful. In September of 2010 indicate 78% of our third grade students needing only core instruction within the classroom. Initial fourth grade scores indicate 80% needing core instruction. Finally, fifth grade students beginning assessment information show 51% falling within the core reading range. Krause Later Elementary MEAP scores continuously rank amongst the highest in Macomb County. Below are the MEAP scores for the past six years with the percentages indicating the number of students proficient.
