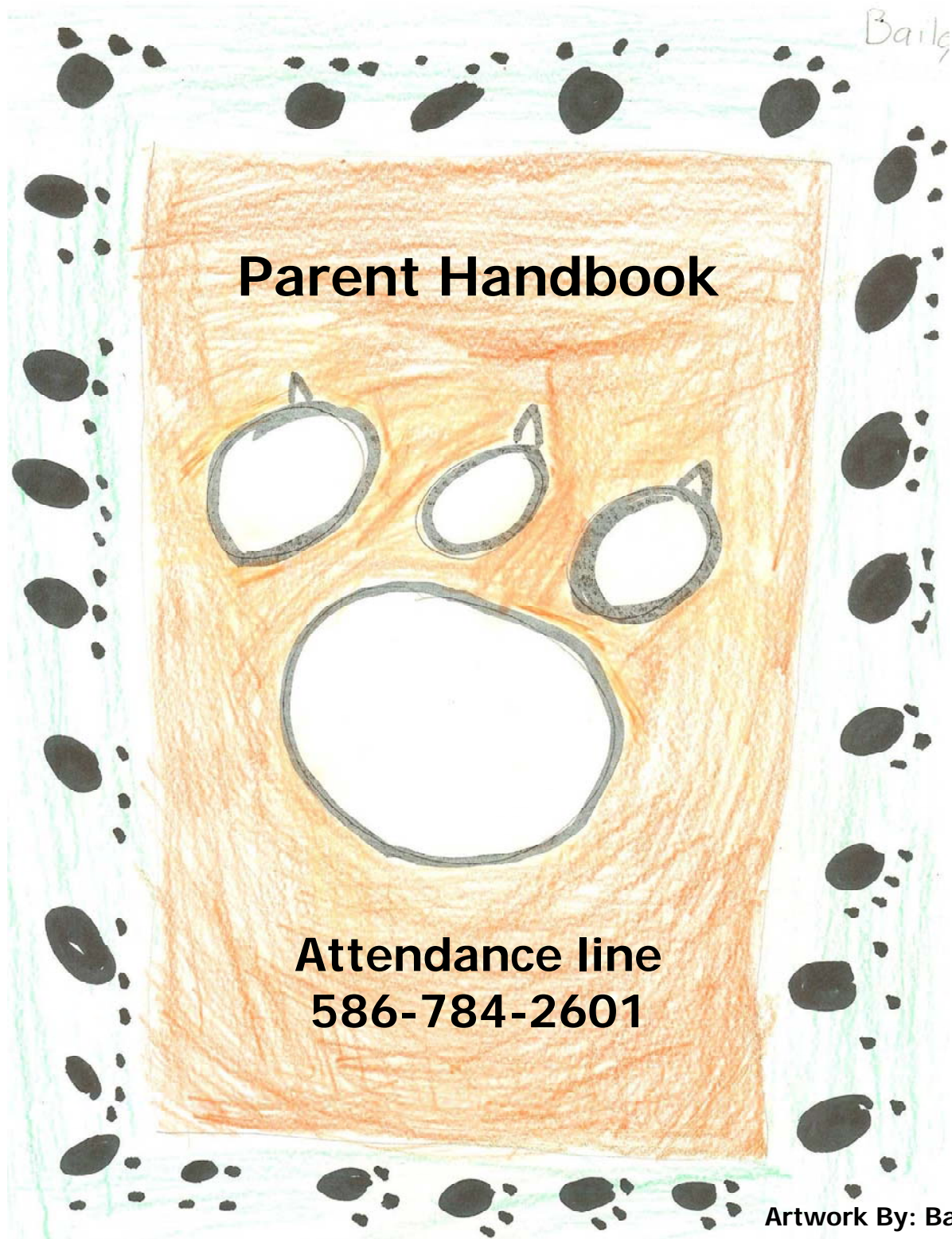

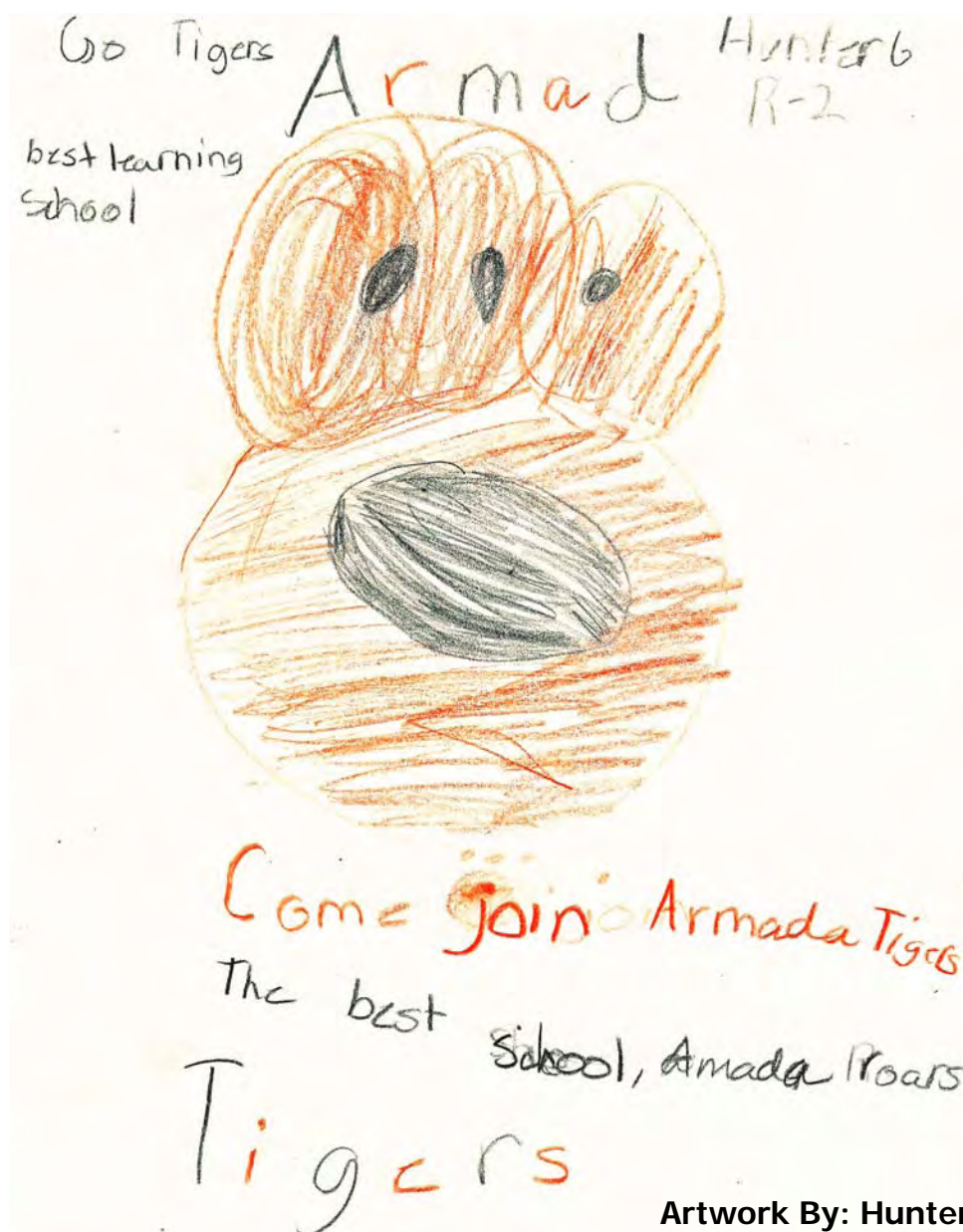

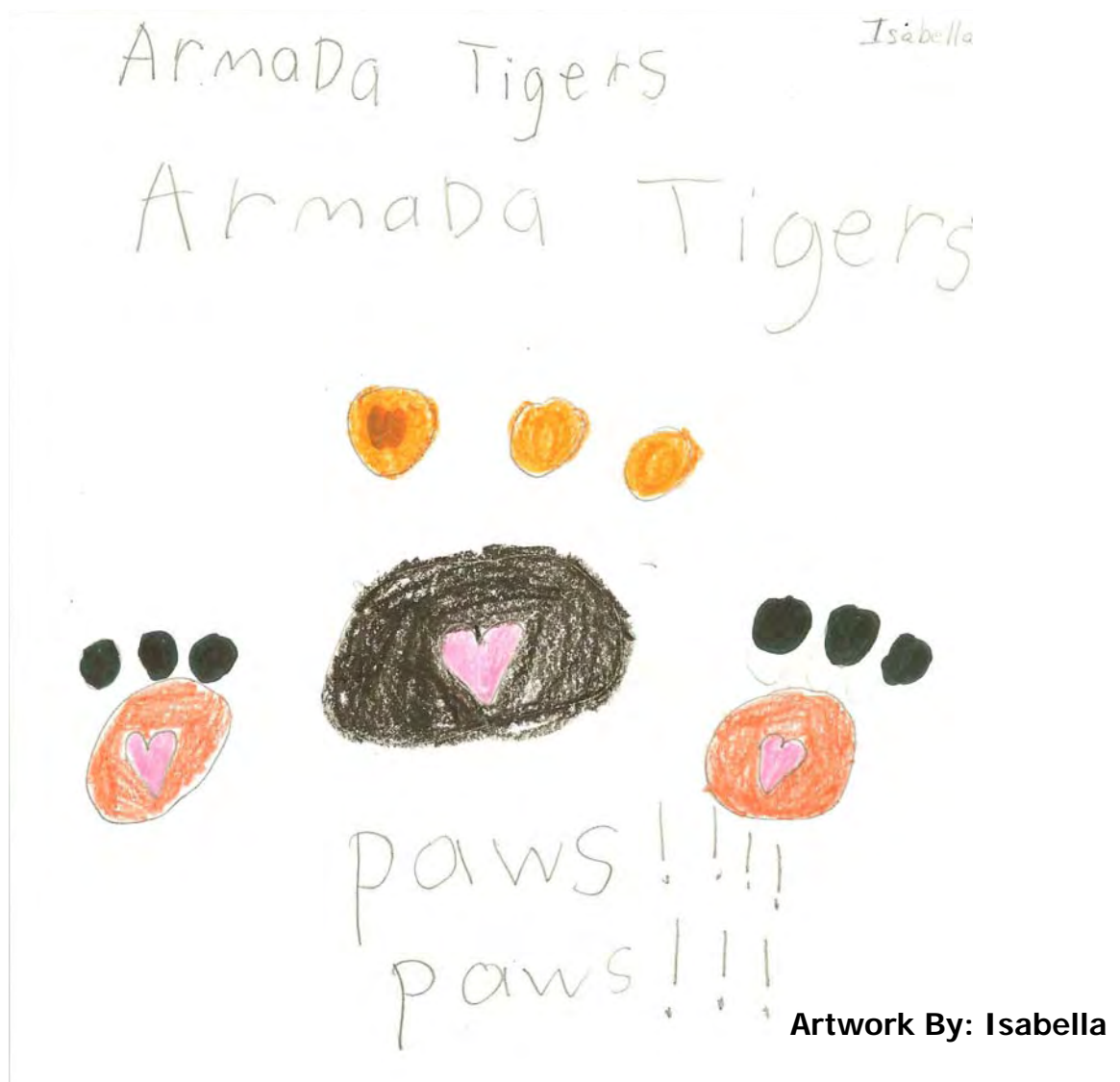
## **Armada is a "School of Choice"**

- Armada is a "School of Choice" district and welcomes students living within the jurisdiction of the Macomb Intermediate School District and contiguous counties (Lapeer and St. Clair) for grades K-12 (there is no School of Choice option for A.P.P.L.E. programs).
- Applications for students wishing to start the school year at Armada Area Schools are accepted throughout the summer months and through Friday of the first week of school.
- Students wishing to begin attending Armada Area Schools mid-year, may do so by applying for School of Choice acceptance during a predetermined window of opportunity prior to the start of the second trimester. The second application period for the 2010-2011 school year begins on November 9, 2010 with applications being accepted through November 23, 2010.
- Applications can be obtained from any school office, the district website or at the district administration building. All applications are subject to approval by the Superintendent.
- Districts may not transport School of Choice students to/from other districts; however, bus stops will be made available within the district boundaries, whenever possible.
- In accordance with the rules of the Michigan High School Athletic Association, all non-resident students (including School of Choice students) are ineligible for interscholastic athletics for one full semester.
- School of Choice students are approved for attendance through graduation from Armada Area Schools, provided there is no interruption in enrollment.



## Child Care and Preschool

- Full-day child care for ages three years to fifth grade from 6:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.
- All services are provided in accordance with all of the State of Michigan licensing requirements.
- Preschool classes are also housed in Krause Early Elementary. The preschool curriculum is aligned with the Language Arts curriculum implemented in Readiness and Kindergarten.

## Office Procedures/Dismissal

- A note should be sent to your child's teacher if there is going to be a change in your child's dismissal that day.
- Please remember to put your child's first and last name on the note. The note will be transferred to the office for approval.
- For **EMERGENCY PURPOSES ONLY**, you may call the office **before 2:30 p.m.** and they will send down a note to your child letting them know of the change.
- If your child goes someplace once or twice per week (i.e.: childcare every Monday) you may write just one note for the year. Example: Every Monday Jane Doe will go to childcare after school.
- If your child will be picked up early:
  - 1) You or an approved person listed on your *Emergency Contact Form* must report to the office.
  - 2) Proper photo identification must be provided.

## Emergency School Closing – Instant Alert

Instant Alert® is an automated communication system designed to notify parents and staff of school closings and important messages as well as everyday activities. Instant Alert has been set up to contact users by their home phone number. If you would like to update your on-line profile (input/change your personal contact information, add contacts, select which type of school information you would like to receive), **log into your profile** at <https://instantalert.honeywell.com>.

## School Visitors/Safety and Security

- For the safety of all of the students, please check in at the front office to get a visitor pass.
- Video cameras monitor the school hallways 24-hours a day.
- All but main entrance doors are locked during school hours.
- Drills for fire, weather and lock– down are practiced extensively throughout the year.

## Attendance Policy/Reporting Absences:

- If your child is sick, please make sure to call the 24-hour attendance hotline at **586-784-2601** by 8:30 a.m. the day of his/her absence.
- If the line is busy, please wait a few moments and try again.
- Please limit your "child will be absent" call to the essentials only. A perfect sample call would be: "This is Mrs. Smith calling, my daughter, Mary Smith, in Mrs. Brown's room will be absent today because of the flu." (**please include reason for absence**)
- If your child has a contagious disease (examples: pink eye, strep throat, chickenpox) please remember to get a doctor's note to return to school.
- If your child is absent 3 days in a row you will need a doctor's note to return to school. You may request homework be sent to the office for pick-up or to go home with another student.
- If you do not call, the school will start calling to check on your child's absence. We will first call your home, cell phone, then proceed to call your place of employment and if we have no response we will then call the emergency numbers on your child's emergency form.
- If your child comes to school late they must stop in the office for a tardy slip before going to class.

## Student Medication at School:

- For both prescription and over-the-counter medication, it is necessary to have a form from the office filled out by both the parent and by the doctor.
- The medication must be in the original container labeled with the child's name, medication and dosage.
- All medications are kept under lock and key in the office and will be administered by trained office staff.

## Library Media Center - Policies and Procedures

### Checkouts

Krause Elementary students are allowed to checkout one book at a time. This number may be increased if a student is working on a research project and needs more materials. The library is open during the entire school day (except during the librarian's lunch period), so students can exchange books at any time.



At the beginning of the school year Kindergarteners and Readiness students are allowed to check out books from a special area of the library. This area has numerous baskets that are sorted and filled with books about their favorite characters such as Arthur, Berenstain Bears, Clifford, Super Heroes, Star Wars, Princesses, Barbie, and many more.

After Christmas they will be shown how to use shelf markers properly. They will then be able to choose a book off the library shelves.

### Late Books

If a book is not returned to the Library on or before the day it is due, it is considered to be overdue. If a student is absent on the due date for personal reasons (illness, doctor's appointment, etc.), the late fee will be removed from the computer system *if the student brings the book to the Library on the day (s)he returns to school **AND** tells the adult at the circulation desk that (s)he was absent.*

If we know in advance that a class will be missing library because of a field trip or scheduled day off, we extend the due date to the next time that class will be coming to library. **In the event of a snow day, books should be returned to the library the next day school is in session.**

### Lost Books

If a student loses a library book, we wait a period of six to eight weeks before sending a note requesting payment.

### Fines

The fine for a late book is one penny per school day. If a student has been absent, (s)he **MUST** tell the adult at the circulation desk this when they return the book. This is the only way we can waive the fine and avoid unnecessary fine notices. The best way to pay a fine is to tape the payment to the fine notice. You wouldn't believe how many times we've found a penny lying on the desk from someone who "paid" their library fine! **Please do not put fine payments inside the book or tape them to the cover.**

## Library Media Center - continued

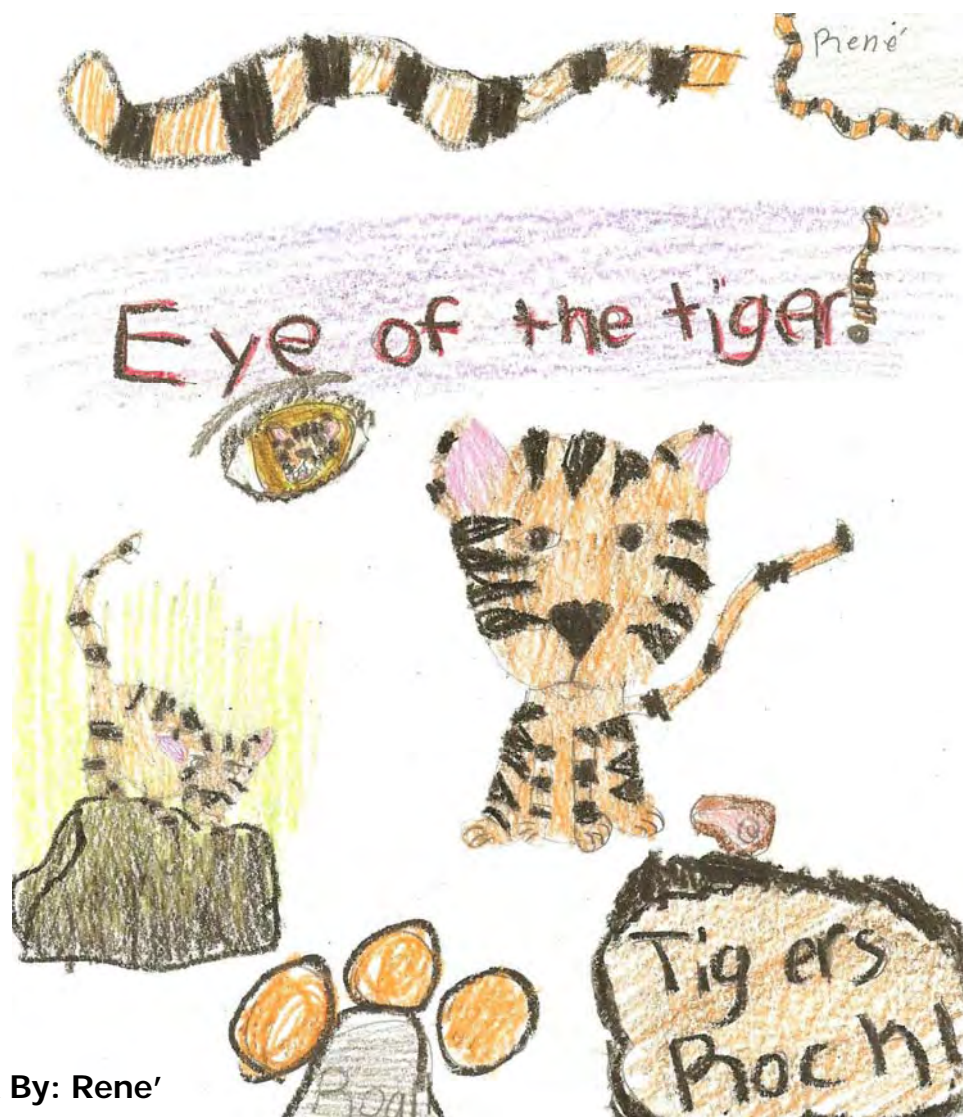
### Damaged Books

We do not charge a fee if a damaged book can be repaired and returned to circulation. If the book is damaged beyond repair, we charge the replacement cost of the book.

### Unpaid Fines

A student is given two weeks to pay a library fine with cash. Kindergarten students are not charged fines until February.

Part of the library experience is learning responsibility for library materials. We hope that these procedures will help to reinforce those lessons.

## Rules and Regulations for Bus Riding Students



- Bus riding is a privilege and you must abide by all rules and regulations and treat your driver and fellow students with courtesy and respect. Any student who defies the bus driver in any way may lose his/her bus privileges. Drivers have the responsibility of getting students to and from school safely. They must have your cooperation at all times. **DRIVERS MAY ASSIGN SEATS AS NEEDED.**
- **STUDENTS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO RIDE OTHERS BUSES.** Students are permitted to ride their own bus and be dropped off at a different location with a note from their parent or guardian and signed by the school administration office. If a student does not have a note, the student will be denied the requested drop off and will be delivered to their home residence.
- You must be at your stop at least five minutes before the bus arrives, as drivers are told they must not wait for tardy students.
- You will board your bus from the side of the road. Do not stand in the roadway. Traffic Safety Association recommends that you wait 10 feet back from your stop, away from the danger zone. Pertaining to mail boxes, students must not approach their mailbox until the bus has vacated his or her stop.
- If crossing a road to board or exit a bus, students must always cross in front of the bus (STATE LAW). Students should be approximately 10 feet away from the front of the bus when crossing, making sure to use the bus driver's help and looking both ways before crossing.
- There shall be no running or shoving at loading or unloading zones.
- No eating or drinking on the bus.



## Bus Riding Rules — continued

- Students must remain seated while the bus is in motion. Do not leave your seat to exit until your driver has stopped the bus.
- Students are not permitted to save seats for fellow students. You must move over and share the seat and permit room for other students. It may be necessary to have three students per seat.
- Fighting on a bus could/will result in suspension from riding a bus.
- Use of profanity could/will result in suspension from riding a bus.
- Students are expected to help keep the bus clean. Litter should be placed in the trash can on the bus.
- Any bus damage will be paid for by the students involved and/or riding privilege will be withdrawn.

A box for lost items is located across from the Child Care Room 136. Lost and Found articles are set out for pick up during November conferences, Spring conferences and any big parent event.

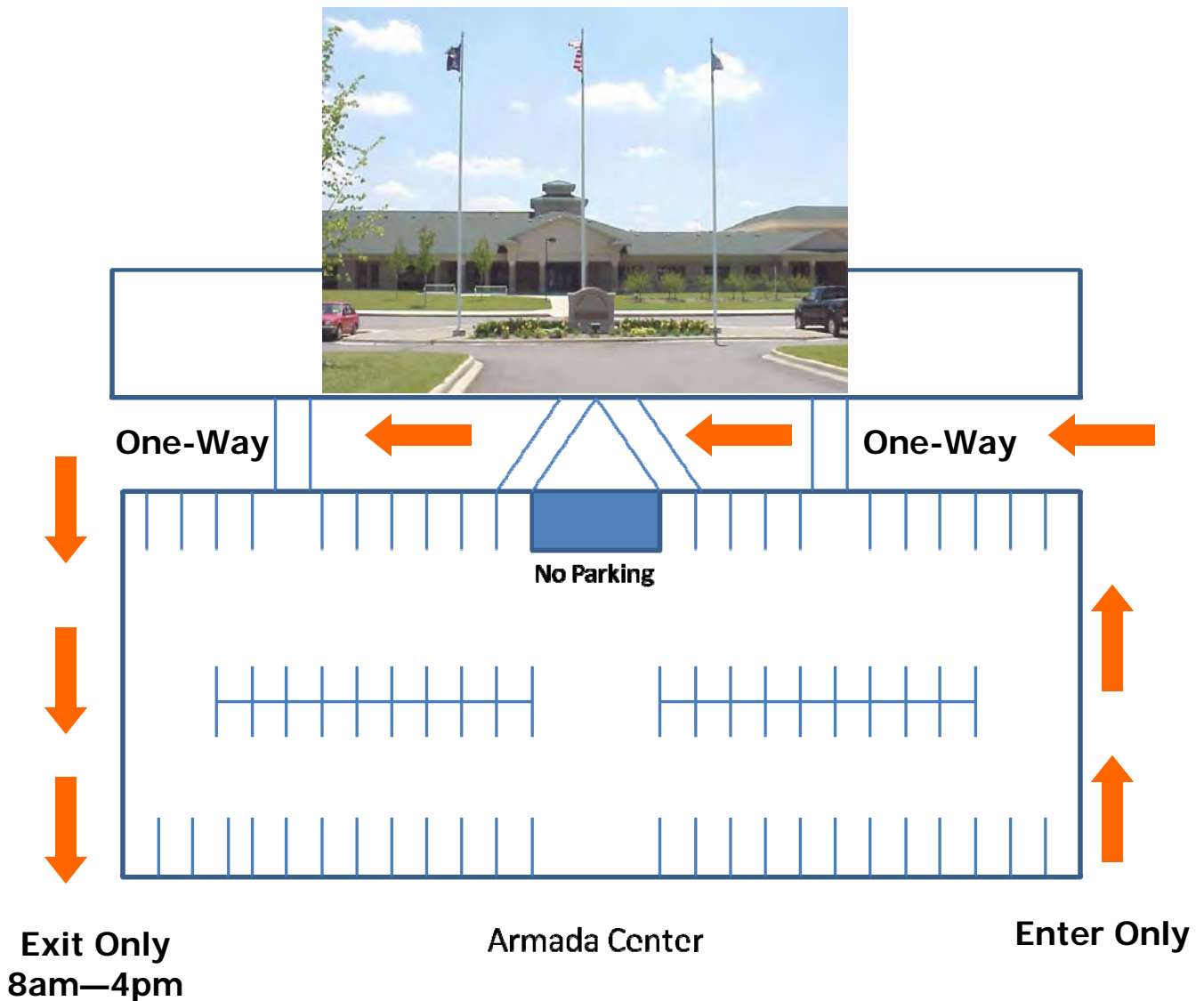
## School Newsletters

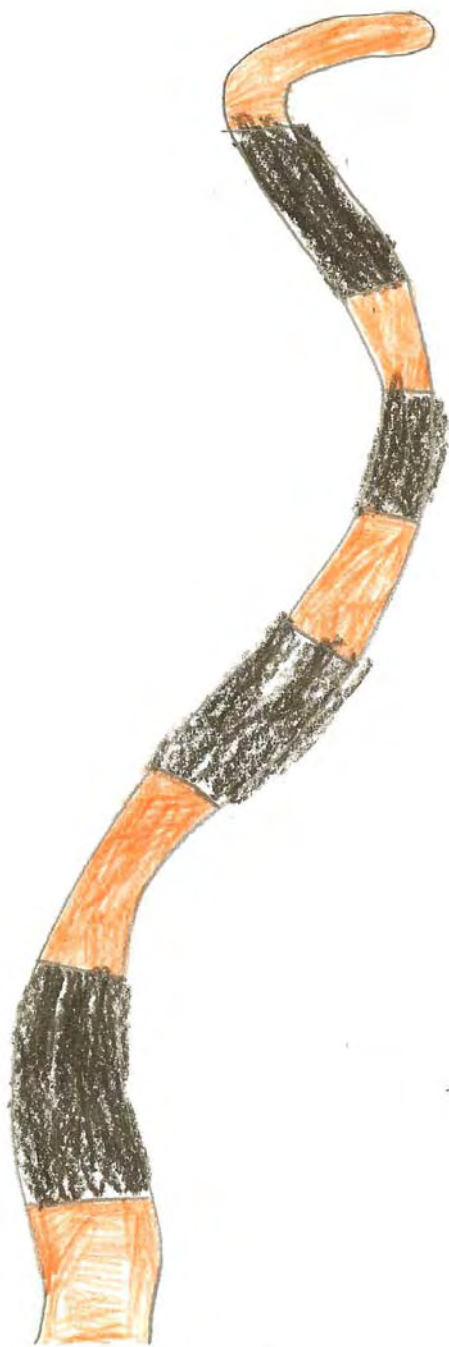
There is a Krause Elementary school newsletter that is distributed once a month and a Tiger Booster Cubs (TCB) Newsletter that goes out once a month.
