The Armada Community:

Armada Area Schools serves the Village of Armada along with portions of the Townships of: Armada, Ray, Bruce, Lenox, Richmond, Berlin, and Riley. The district lies in north-central Macomb County and the west-southwest corner of St. Clair County. Armada is 40 miles northeast of downtown Detroit and offers a semi-rural atmosphere, yet quick access to nearby, larger suburban communities. The area is attractive because of its quaint village, orchards, larger home parcels, and community values. The district has one of the highest household incomes in the county and state as it attracts entrepreneurial and professional residents.

Trimester Schedule: Five class periods of seventy-three minutes. All classes meet five days per week.

Curriculum:

- College preparatory program to be enhanced with more electives through trimester schedule
- Advanced Placement courses offered in Literature/Composition, US History, World History, Art Portfolio, Biology, and Calculus.
- Vocational classes offered in Building Trades, Automotive Technology, Computer Aided Drafting, Health Occupations, EMT, Marketing, and Career Internship.
- Students may apply to attend the Macomb Academy of Arts and Sciences, the District math science center specializing in research-based learning. Half a day is spent at the Academy.
- 100% of our core classes are taught by highly-qualified teachers.
- Consistently among the top schools in the county for Michigan Merit Exam performance.
