A Word from our Director


Dear Parents,

Alumni Corner

After graduating from the Macomb Academy of Arts and Sciences and Armada High School, Jenna attended the University of Michigan – Ann Arbor. She says she is intrigued by the choices she has available to her at this time in her life.

Jenna took the time to share several comments and observations about her time at the Academy, "I felt very well prepared for college academically, since the Academy encourages the students to take responsibility for their own learning. This format

of classes and the assignments given to Academy students really mimics the kind of things you can expect once you're in college."

Her words of advice for current Academy students include "Respect the education you're getting. The mentality of many high school students (and college ones) is to get enough information to get through the next test, purge, and start up on the new material without retaining much of what just happened. Take advantage of your teachers as resources – they are there to help, and they are great at what they do. Take advantage of your fellow students as resources, everyone has something that they're good at; you can learn a lot from them. And most importantly, take advantage of your own learning; you're at a time in your life when you're at the cusp of the rest of your life. Learn it now, or you'll definitely wish you had."

BEYOND THE WALLS – ENDLESS OPPORTUNITIES

The 6th grade AMA²S students in Mrs. Markey's Science class participated in a lesson that was given completely in an online environment. The students used blogs, WebQuests, virtual tours and screencasts to learn about rocks, volcanoes, earthquakes, and the formation of mountains. Blackboard, a web-based learning management system, acted as the interface for communication as the students received and submitted their finished work. This method of learning was a big hit among the students and provided them with unlimited resources in their quest for knowledge. It also addressed several technology standards from the International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE) whose goal is to create proficiency in global learning in the digital age.

ACADEMY CLEANS UP

On Wednesday, June 1st, 9th – 11th grade students pitched in right alongside teachers to cleanup the school's gardens and grounds. Flowers were planted, hedges were trimmed, and weeds were pulled on what turned out to be a beautiful summer day. TO CATCH A MOUSE – IN 2011

The 7th grade Academy science students in Ms. Stephanie DeMarco's class have been energetically working on their last project of the year entitled – The Mousetrap Project. The original game of Mousetrap first hit the marketplace in 1963 – almost a ½ century ago. The 7th grade students' 2011 version incorporates many similar qualities of the original game but focuses more directly on various concepts of physics such as Newton's 3rd law of Motion. After the students create their ideal mousetrap and subsequently catch their mouse – they use current day technology to videotape their mousetrap in action. Their movies are then presented to the class at large in a final project

presentation. When Ms. DeMarco asked the students if they liked this project, they responded with an overwhelming shout of "YES!" Some students remarked that they especially liked the hands-on construction of this project and really liked the way they could bring their own personalities into their mousetrap design.
