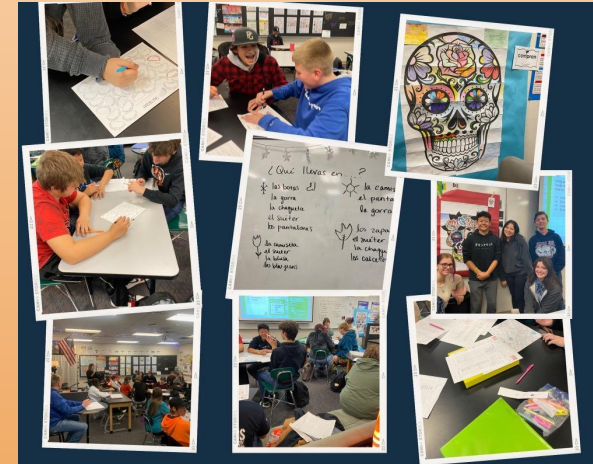

Unique academic and extracurricular opportunities, such as:

- Multiple AP and college credit courses offered on site. (13 AP courses)
- Early college and dual enrollment, (approximately 15% of AHS students)
- Multiple academic support classes.
- Support classes for math- Ex: geometry with geometry assist class.
- Multiple CTE courses- Ex: Small Engines, Culinary, Construction Trades.
- Lunchtime and after school tutoring for all students- we listened to our students.
- After school extracurriculars like Quiz Bowl, Reading Club, Dungeons and Dragons, Student Council, Mock Trial, Fishing Club, Marching Band, Theatre, Ski Club, and others.
- Multiple athletic opportunities for each season.

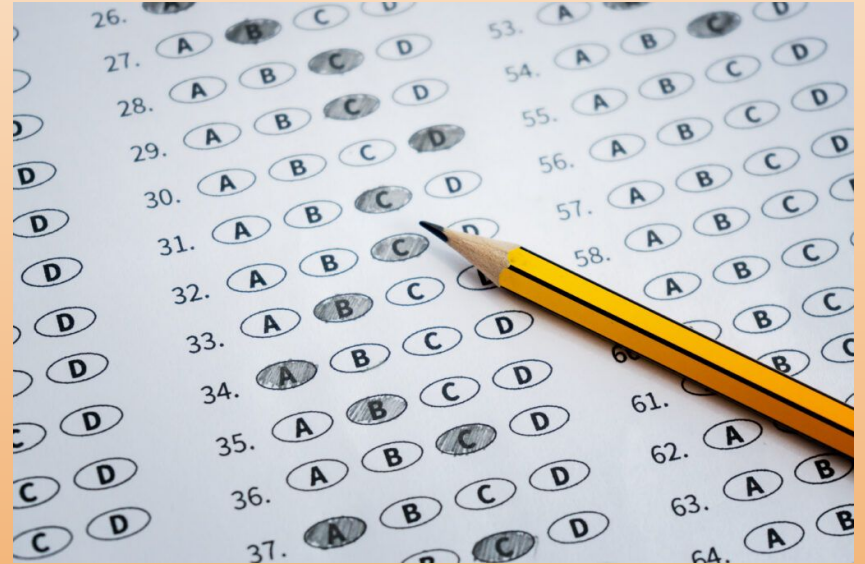

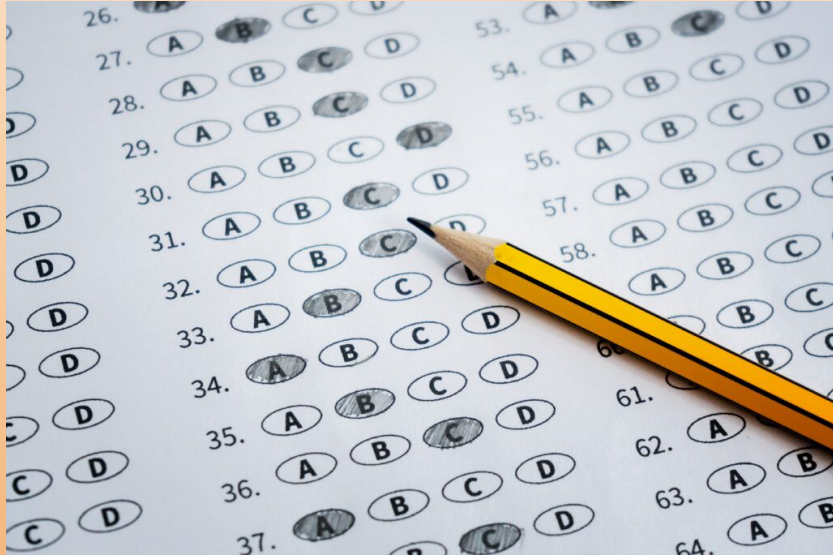

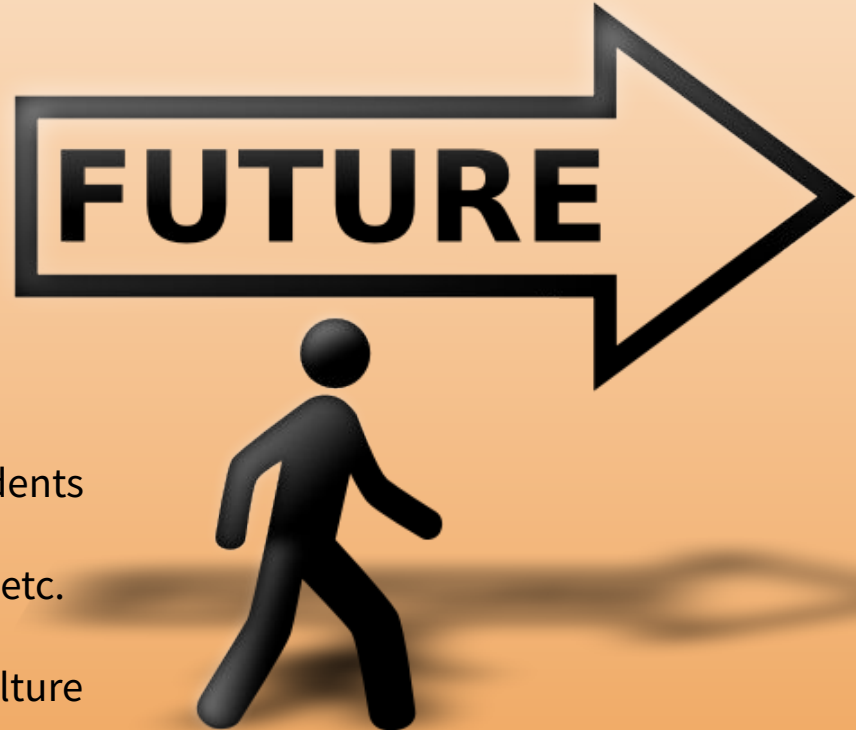
