Dear Armada Area School Families,

I wanted to share a brief update on the start of our 2022-23 school year. Other than the two power outage days, we are off to a good start this school year. Last spring, the district went through a strategic planning process. Two focus areas from our strategic planning process are to bring back normalcy and joy to the education process and to continually address safety needs of the district.

Our secondary students have returned to a six-period day; all students (K-12) are served lunches in the cafeteria; hallway lockers are available to secondary students; and parent volunteers have returned to all buildings. Returning to our pre-pandemic practices has helped us get back to normal. As for safety needs, we will have additional liaison officers on campus this school year. Currently, we have two security liaisons in the district every day and plan on increasing that to three every day in the near future. Also, we have hired a district nurse who will be housed at the elementary school, but is available to all students in the district.
